Act 158 Explained: 5 Pathways to Graduation

Big Spring offers five different pathways to graduation, aimed at supporting all students in achieving postsecondary readiness in college, career and life.

The pathways align with the Pennsylvania Department of Education's Act 158, passed in 2018. Before this change, graduation required certain scores on the Keystone Exams in Algebra I, Biology, and Literature.

Now, students with unique strengths and aspirations can achieve graduation in a variety of ways that reflect their future goals and their actual readiness. This change signals the state of Pennsylvania and Big Spring School District recognize all students can succeed. The reality is that most BSHS students could graduate through several of the pathways explained below.

1. Keystone Proficiency Pathway: Students score proficient or above in all three Keystone Exams.
2. Keystone Composite Pathway: Allows for a combined total score on the Keystone Exams, with no below basic individual scores.
3. Career & Technical Education Pathway: For students focusing on vocational skills, involving relevant courses and a certification or vocational program completion.
4. Alternative Assessment Pathway: Students can qualify through other standardized tests or participate in dual enrollment programs to earn college credit.
5. Evidence-Based Pathway: Students can use a mix of high scores on advanced exams, college courses completed in high school, or professional credentials to qualify.
